


Clay Shooting For a Cause

Recurring Donations – To Make a Greater Impact

Recurring donations are a great way to support Heinzerling Community throughout the year. As a donor, you can specify the amount and timing of your donation during the year. This type of giving decreases our administrative costs and provides our organization with a more consistent, sustainable, and predictable income to carry out our mission.
